In Memoríam

It is with deep regret to announce the passing of Legionnaire Claude L.

GOSSOO, 79 died Tuesday May 10, 2011 at the Kingston Hospital. He was born at home on Sept. 17, 1931 son of the late Mason Caleb Gossoo and Anna Pope MacDonald Gossoo. He went to grade school in Shandaken, and graduated from Richfield Springs Central Schools. Claude was a 20 year Air Force veteran, with all of his years of service in the aircraft maintenance field as a member of the Strategic Air Command working on KC97 tankers and cargo aircrafts. Claude was crew chief and flight mechanic for Maj. Gen. Allison C. Brooks Commander of Air-Sea Rescue Aircrafts. He was Air Force Crew Chief of the year 1967 and Pacific Air Force maintenance man of the quarter. His Air Force service took him north over the North Pole, South to Uruguay, East to Spain, and West to Japan and Viet Nam. After his service, Claude worked for 20 years as a custodian at Onteora Central School. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, and spent several weeks each year in British Columbia fishing with

hís older brother Don. He was a past member of the Schuyler Lake and Shandaken Fire Departments. Lífe member, past Adjutant, and Commander of Shandaken VFW Post No. 2837, American Legion Post No. 1026 of Woodstock member, Lífe member of A.F.Sergeants Assn., Air Force Assn., D.A.V., and Friends of the Air Force Museum.

Surviving are his sister in-laws Midge and Lena Gosso both of Shandaken, several nephews and nieces, and special friend and caregiver Patti Jeffreys. He was predeceased by his brothers Mason, Findley, Donald, sister Eleanor LeBeau, and nephew David Gossoo.

It is with deep regret to announce the passing of Legionnaire John-Eric

Schuman, 40 currently of Saugerties and a longtime Rhinebeck resident, died suddenly on Friday, May 20th, 2011 at his home. Born on Oct. 15, 1970, in Huntington, he was the son of the late Edward R. Schuman and Arlene (Olson) Schuman of Rhinebeck. John-Eric spent the first 15 years of his life in Centerport. John-Eric was the owner and operator of Cinematic Stunts. He was a member of the Screen Actors Guild. As a stunt coordinator he specialized in fight choreography, weapons/ firearms, precision driving and military consultation. John-Eric was a seasoned boxer, martial artist, firearms specialist, stunt driver and motocross racer. John's over 25 years of training, military service, and education in filmmaking has <mark>cast himself as a leader in the field</mark> of stunts. He was the only stunt coordinator to hold National Championship titles as a fighter and to be a United States Special Operations Soldier. John-Eric is trained as a parachutist as well as in Helicopter Operations including rappelling, stabo, helocasting and safety procedures. John-Eric began his boxing career in 1979, his martial arts career in 1982 and he has been choreographing fight sequences for over 15 years. He has also studied acrobatics and high falls. He served in the United States Army Ranger with Special Operations and was a member of the Disabled American Veterans. In addition to his loving mother, he is survived by a sister; Kathryn Schuman of Clermont, two nephews; Peter and Padraic Orsulich of Clermont, and many friends.

RETURN THE F.A.V.O.R. (FIND & ASSIST VETS OF RECORD)

Ulster County is joining the ranks of Rockland, Orange, Putnam and others in offering veterans a discount purchasing program. The return the F.A.V.O.R. (Find & Assist Veterans of Record) discount program will give honorably discharged veterans the opportunity to apply for a County-issued I.D. card which will allow them to obtain discounts on goods and services at local participating businesses. Veterans who wish to apply for this program should visit the Veterans' Service Agency located at 308 Flatbush Avenue in Kingston. They will need to present their DD-214 discharge papers in order to qualify. Once the proper documentation has been verified, veterans will go to the County Clerk's Office at 244 Fair Street, Kingston to have their picture taken and receive their discount card.


